ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS AND CHECKLIST

- Applicants wishing to apply for the ADT program should fill-out the online application completely. WTC admission representative will contact the applicant to start the admission process.
- Applicants must be at least 18 years of age by the start of the program.
- Applicants must be a high school graduate or equivalent. Official high school transcripts must be received directly from the high school and sent to the ADT Program Director to process the application. Prospective students may present a copy of their high school transcript to the admissions representative for initial evaluation, but the application will not be processed until an official transcript is received.
 - A GED will be accepted in lieu of a high school transcript.
 - Transcripts must be from a national or regionally accredited school recognized by the Department of Education.
- Applicants will be required to sign an attestation acknowledging that they do not have a criminal background. Having a criminal background may disqualify the applicant during the hiring process.

To be completed after ADT application and Attestation document has been submitted

- Applicants must take the Wonderlic scholastic level exam (SLE) administered at the campus by a WTC associate.
- Applicants must submit two letters of recommendation from an appropriate source, i.e., previous employers, teachers, instructors/mentors, etc. Not acceptable are family members, friends, colleagues, etc
- Applicants must go through a panel interview. To be scheduled on Fridays.
- Application and requested documents must be submitted directly to the ADT Program Director at the address listed above by the deadline date.
- College transfer credit** will be evaluated. General Education courses must have been completed within the past ten years, and technical courses must be completed within the past five years in order to be eligible for credit consideration. Courses considered must have a grade of B or better. Official transcript(s) will be required. ***Please note: Official*** transcript(s) must come directly from the college and be sent to the ADT Program Director.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

- 1.) Applicants must complete the “*Application for Admission*” form and submit the completed application to start the application process.
- 2.) Applicants who meet the above-listed requirements will be invited for an interview.
- 3.) Applicants will be admitted into the ADT program based on a point system that accounts for the complete application, program entrance exam (SLE), and interview.
- 4.) A maximum of 20 students will be selected for admission into each cohort. Several alternates may be selected to fill available seats, in case an applicant declines his/her acceptance into the program or did not complete the requested requirements on time.

The application deadline is **September 12, 2020**. Applicants who submit incomplete and/or late applications (postmarked or delivered) after the deadline date must reapply for the next application cycle.

The anticipated start date for the upcoming class is **September 25, 2020**.

ACCEPTED students will be required to complete the following PRIOR TO THE START OF CLASSES.

Signature agreement to the following forms: Consent for Laboratory Activities, Consent to Participate, receipt of Crime Awareness Program form, Drug-free Schools Student Statement, Software Policy, Student Media Release, Professional Dress, and other forms as requested.

ACCEPTANCE INTO THE ADT PROGRAM

Acceptance into the ADT program will be based on several criteria and, ultimately, on the score that will be determined based on your overall application packet (all the components of your application). Each component of the application packet will be ranked. Applicants with the highest cumulative scores will be offered seats in the program (up to the maximum number of seats available) if all criteria are met, and there are no extenuating circumstances that may preclude an applicant from acceptance (see the WTC catalog for “Technical Standards” for the ADT program). Cumulative points, or overall scores, for each application, are confidential.

Entrance into the ADT program is a competitive process, and the application or meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission into the program. Upon successful completion of all admissions requirements, the school will promptly notify the applicant whether he/she is admitted into the ADT program. The admissions policies are included in the college catalog and the webpage.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS AFTER ADMISSION INTO THE PROGRAM

- 1.) Applicants must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 in each course in the program. A second failed course will result in dismissal from the program.
- 2.) Applicants must maintain a minimum of 85% attendance for the duration of the program. If attendance drops below 85%, it will result in dismissal from the program.
- 3.) Applicants must remain physically, emotionally, and mentally capable of completing the program.
- 4.) Employers may have additional requirements.
